

**MTR Launches Special Fare Days on 1 and 2 October 2017
to Celebrate the 20th Anniversary of Hong Kong SAR**

Customers travelling around during the public holidays on 1 and 2 October 2017 can enjoy major savings as the MTR Corporation announced today (22 August) that a special one-off fare programme will be launched on these two days to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the establishment of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR).

Adult Octopus holders traveling on the MTR on 1 and 2 October will enjoy concessionary fares equal to Child Octopus fares while concessionary Octopus holders will enjoy a flat fare of \$1 per domestic journey (except the Airport Express, MTR Feeder Bus, journeys to or from Lo Wu and Lok Ma Chau stations and East Rail Line First Class Premium). This special promotion is applied together with the 3% rebate currently offered for every single Octopus trip as well as other fare promotion including the interchange discount, the Fare Saver discount and the 25% discount for connecting journeys with the Monthly Pass Extra (for Adult Octopus only).

Customers can enjoy unlimited rides with the discount on these days, see examples of fare discount in the Annex.

Annex: Examples of Fare Discounts on 1 and 2 October 2017

Example 1

Discounted Adult Octopus Trip (with Fare Saver and 3% Rebate)

Tsuen Wan Station to Central Station	
Child Octopus Fare	\$6.7
Fare Saver Discount	\$2.0
3% Rebate	\$0.3 (Child Octopus fare \$6.7 x 3% = \$0.201 rounded up to \$0.3)
Actual fare paid	\$4.4 (\$6.7 - \$2.0 - \$0.3)

Example 2

Discounted Child Octopus Trip (with 3% Rebate)

Sheung Shui Station to Kowloon Tong Station	
Fare	\$1.0
3% Rebate	\$0.1 (\$1.0 x 3% = \$0.03 rounded up to \$0.1)
Actual fare paid	\$0.9 (\$1.0 - \$0.1)

Example 3
Discounted Adult Octopus Trip
(with Interchange Discount and 3% Rebate)

Wong Chuk Hang Station to Admiralty Station	
Child Octopus Fare	\$3.4
Interchange Discount	\$0.5
3% Rebate	\$0.2 (Child Octopus fare $\$3.4 \times 3\% = \0.102 rounded up to \$0.2)
Actual fare paid	\$2.7 ($\$3.4 - \$0.5 - \0.2)
