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MTR implements crowd management measures for major events

The MTR Corporation would like to advise passengers that crowd management measures will be implemented at stations of Airport Express, Tung Chung Line and Disneyland Resort Line during the coming two Fridays and weekends to cope with the anticipated increase in passengers because of major events.

The events, mainly concerts, will be held at the Disneyland Resort and AsiaWorld–Expo in the evenings of 4, 5, 6, 11, 12 and 13 May 2018. To facilitate passengers to travel to and from the venues, the MTR Operations Control Centre will closely monitor the situation and maintain smooth train service through train regulation when necessary.

Additional staff will also be deployed to stations, particularly Hong Kong, AsiaWorld–Expo, Sunny Bay and Disneyland Resort stations, to assist passengers. Depending on the actual situation, special crowd management measures will be implemented to control passenger flow and maintain order at the stations. Passengers may experience longer waiting time on platforms before they board trains. Passengers are reminded to allow more time to travel to the venues, follow the advice of station staff and pay attention to the public announcement, notices and signage at stations.

Passengers may also consider using other public transport or the shuttle bus service provided by the event organisers. *
