**Youngsters Showcase Creativity
at the “New Stations at Tuen Mun” Autumn Market**

Local youngsters showcased their creative talents at the “New Stations at Tuen Mun” Autumn Market at the Gold Coast Piazza in Tuen Mun today (19 September 2021). Sponsored and supported by MTR Corporation and coordinated by Yan Oi Tong, a non-government organisation, the autumn market was held with the aim of fostering youth development by providing platforms for youngsters to demonstrate their talents and businesses acumen.

The market was filled with joy and excitement as visitors shopped at the 16 exquisite handcrafts stalls and handmade workshops operated by local youngsters, reflecting the vitality of the Tuen Mun District. Stunning street performances added to the enjoyment of a fun-filled Sunday, including busking, dancing and music shows with the participation by over 60 youngsters throughout the day.

The event featured an exhibition and special game booth by the MTR Corporation as part of the Tuen Mun South Extension project roving exhibition launched in the district in late August 2021. This is part of an ongoing effort to engage the community by the Corporation as it embarks on the railway extension project in Tuen Mun. The Tuen Mun South Extension will extend the Tuen Ma Line approximately 2.4km southward from Tuen Mun Station via A16 Station to a new terminus near Tuen Mun Ferry Pier upon completion.
