

**Extend “Rebate for Every Trip” for Half Year  
No Actual Fare Change for Octopus Passengers until Late June 2022**

To continue to ride out the difficult times with the public in time of pandemic, the MTR Corporation today (23 November 2021) announced the extension of a special fare concession for another six months until end June 2022. The Corporation will bear over \$200 million out of additional resources for this extension of special fare concession.

MTR fares have been reduced by 1.85% since 27 June 2021, coupled with the Corporation’s topping up the committed rebate for every trip under the Fare Adjustment Mechanism (FAM) to 3.8% for six months from the same day. Starting from 2 January until end June 2022, the Corporation will set aside additional resources to extend the special relief measure, where Octopus or QR code ticket passengers<sup>1</sup> can continue to enjoy “3.8% Rebate for Every Trip”. Even before the rebate, the Octopus fare level is lower than that in late June 2019.

“Both MTR and Hong Kong people have been facing continuous challenges amidst the COVID-19 pandemic over the past two years. Though the economy is gradually recovering, we understand that our passengers are still struggling with the economic uncertainties. As a Hong Kong-rooted company, MTR with all its staff are dedicated to keep Hong Kong moving, and through the rebate extension aim to show appreciation to our passengers as we move to next year.” said Ms Jeny Yeung, Hong Kong Transport Services Director of the MTR Corporation.

The \$50 flat reduction<sup>2</sup> of “Monthly Pass Extra” will end in December 2021, while the reduction for “MTR City Saver” will last until 1 January 2022 (see Appendix 1 for ticket prices). That said, passengers using these tickets can still save around 30% fare expenses than using adult Octopus.

Furthermore, “Sung Wong Toi / To Kwa Wan / Hin Keng / Kai Tak Stations Fare Discount”<sup>3</sup> and “Special Interchange Discount” in celebration of the commissioning of Tuen Ma Line will also end on 1 January 2022. Starting from 2 January 2022, the MTR Corporation will launch a new series of “Interchange Discount” in collaboration with 3 Green Minibus and 2 franchised bus routes (see Appendix 2 for details).

**Remarks:**

1. “3.8% Rebate for Every Trip” applies to all Octopus or QR code ticket users travelling on MTR lines (including trips to and from Lo Wu and Lok Ma Chau Stations, except Airport Express), and all Octopus users travelling on Light Rail and MTR buses.
2. Passengers can enjoy a \$50 flat reduction for “Monthly Pass Extra” from July to December 2021, and for “MTR City Saver” from 1 July 2021 to 1 January 2022.

3. Adult Octopus users can save \$1 when travelling on MTR domestic and cross-boundary journeys to or from Sung Wong Toi, To Kwa Wan, Hin Keng or Kai Tak Stations, while other users (including children, elderly, persons with disabilities and students) will enjoy a \$0.5 fare discount until 1 January 2022.
