

Pedestrian Subways between East Tsim Sha Tsui Station and Tsim Sha Tsui Station Transformed into Artwork Corridors

MTR today (14 October 2022) completes the redecoration of the subways connecting East Tsim Sha Tsui and Tsim Sha Tsui stations with iconic murals with artistic directional instructions. Passengers walking along these subways can now enjoy a more aesthetically pleasing and interesting journey. The over 200-metres long murals also serve to give directions and as a guide to various landmarks in Tsim Sha Tsui.

The initiative is MTR's support for the Transport Department's "Walk in HK", which aims to make walking "enjoyable" and "smart". The Corporation has also cooperated with the Hong Kong Tourism Board and the Transport Department to add a QR Code next to each landmark illustration. Passengers can take photos with the landmark illustrations with the help of Augmented Reality (AR). They can also read relevant information about the landmarks, and find the fastest route via "HKeMobility" webpage or mobile app.

3. Passengers can easily identify the destinations nearby with the guidance of the iconic landmark illustrations and directional signs on the murals.


