#### **Reprovisioning and Service Enhancements at Light Rail Tin Wing Stop Deliver Improved Travel Experience “Light Rail Cutie” Makes Debut as MTR Ambassador**

MTR Corporation announced today (24 April 2026) that the reprovisioning works for the Light Rail Tin Wing Stop platforms undertaken to support community development, have been successfully completed and are being commissioned in phases starting from today. The environment has been revitalised with enhancements made to barrier-free facilities and passenger information. In addition, commencing next Monday (27 April 2026), special Route 751P trips to Tin Shui Wai Stop will be added during the weekday morning peak hours (excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and school holidays) to further facilitate passengers commuting to work and school.

#### **Three Major Improvements at Tin Wing Stop for Better Passenger Comfort**

1. **A more comfortable stop environment:** The platforms are located within a covered setting for comfortable passengers experience under all weather conditions. The platform walls and ceilings have also been beautified, with ample lighting provision. New slip-resistant flooring materials have been installed. Drawing reference from the design of MTR heavy rail stations, stop names are displayed on the walls.
2. **Enhanced barrier-free design:** Ramps fitted with dual handrails are installed at both the head and tail ends of all platforms, while new-style seats with armrests provide greater convenience for passengers with diverse needs.
3. **Improved passenger information:** Passenger information display panels and large signage have been installed on platforms, together with prominently positioned QR codes, ensuring that passengers can access Light Rail service information at ease.

Following the reprovisioning of the five platforms at Tin Wing Stop, three of them have been brought into service starting today. Routes 705 and 751, which previously operated at the temporary platform for boarding and alighting, have been relocated to the newly configured Platform 4. The Corporation has strengthened signage and deployed additional staff on site to assist passengers in adapting to the new arrangement. The remaining two platforms will be commissioned at a later stage.

## **“Light Rail Cutie” Makes Debut Appearance to Meet Passengers**

A ceremony was held today at Tin Wing Stop to celebrate the commissioning of the new platforms. The Corporation also introduced its much-anticipated new member and Light Rail Ambassador, “Light Rail Cutie”, who made her first public appearance to meet and engage with passengers by posing for commemorative photos and distributing gifts. A themed Light Rail vehicle featuring “Light Rail Cutie” was also unveiled and will operate across various Light Rail routes, adding a joyful touch to passengers’ journey.

Ms Cheris Lee, Deputy Director - Operating & Metro Segment of MTR Corporation, said, “Tin Wing Stop is one of the major Light Rail stops in the Tin Shui Wai area. By leveraging this re-provisioning opportunity, we are pleased to replan the stop’s layout comprehensively and upgrade its facilities and the waiting environment, enabling us to serve passengers with a refreshed look. We are also delighted to welcome the debut of Light Rail Ambassador, ‘Light Rail Cutie’, whose presence will further strengthen the connection between the railway and the community. MTR will continue to enhance stop facilities, providing passengers with a more convenient and comfortable travel experience.”

## **Ongoing Investment in Upgrading Light Rail Facilities**

In recent years, the Corporation has continued to invest in the enhancement of facilities across multiple Light Rail stops, such as Tai Tong Road Stop, Lam Tei Stop and Tin Shui Wai Stop. Over the past five years, a total investment exceeding HK\$100 million has been allocated to upgrading stops’ infrastructure and improving the overall environment, including the widening of platform waiting areas, the provision of platform ramps, the installation of new-style seats equipped with armrests and the introduction of LED lighting systems across all Light Rail stops (please refer to the Annex for details). On information dissemination, all Light Rail stops are now equipped with Passenger Information Display System, both the System and the MTR Mobile App offer a “Next Train” function, allowing passengers to access real-time arrival time for Light Rail routes. The Corporation will continue to pursue ongoing improvement to the facilities, with the aim of providing passengers with a more comfortable travel environment.
