MTR Hung Hom Station's Railway Experience Exhibition Reopens with Newly Expanded Interactive Experiences Public Invited to Step into the Role of a Train Captain

The MTR Corporation announced today (9 May 2026) that the large scale railway exhibition at Hung Hom Station will reopen to the public on 16 May 2026 with an expanded layout and a refreshed new look. Renamed "Station Rail Voyage: Explorer", the exhibition retains four iconic retired trains on display while introducing a new immersive train driving simulator and a range of interactive experiences, offering the public a one stop opportunity to explore the professional work behind the city's daily railway operations and the close connection between railway development and urban growth.

Step into the role of a Train Captain

The brand-new "Becoming a Train Captain" simulation experience allows visitors to enter a simulated driver training cab and experience the fundamentals of train operation. Discover behind-the-scenes railway operations

Newly added tunnel maintenance and Operations Control Centre scenes enable visitors to learn more about the professionals who ensure the railway safety around the clock. Children can also try on simulated staff and engineering uniforms and take photos in different themed settings, learning about railway safety through play.

Five-metre Ticket Wall Relives Collective City Memories

A five-metre-long giant ticket wall displays more than 2,500 classic MTR tickets and Octopus cards, illustrating the evolution of ticket design alongside the city's development. The exhibition also features a selection of valuable artefacts highlighting key milestones in the construction of Hong Kong's underground railway.

MTR Corporation Chief Executive Officer Ms Jeny Yeung today joined 50 children from different districts and railway enthusiasts to celebrate the reopening of the exhibition. "The 'Station Rail Voyage: Explorer' Exhibition is not only a record of Hong Kong's railway development, but also a reflection of the life journeys of different generations, carrying collective railway memories shared by our community. Through the new interactive and immersive experiences, we hope to offer the public an engaging space where they can appreciate how railways grow alongside the city, while showcasing MTR's commitment to community engagement and public education," said Ms Yeung.
