High Speed Rail (Hong Kong Section) Services Further Upgrade with Direct Destinations Increased to 113 Enhanced Cross-boundary Railway Services for Passenger Convenience During the Tuen Ng Festival Long Weekend

MTR Corporation continues to enhance cross-boundary railway services on the High Speed Rail (Hong Kong Section) (HSR) to support daily commuting, tourism and business travel. Following coordination with Chinese Mainland railway authorities, three new stations—Guangzhoubei, Yiwu and Fuqingxi—will be added from 1 July this year, bringing the total number of direct destinations to 113. Moreover, during the Tuen Ng Festival long weekend, service frequency on the East Rail Line will be increased. Additional short-haul HSR services to and from Futian Station will also be arranged to facilitate passengers' travel.

Ongoing enhancement of HSR services

The HSR network continues to expand, offering direct connections to an increasing number of tourist destinations and major economic centres. Starting from 1 July, three new destinations will be added to selected long-haul routes:

- **Guangzhoubei Station:** Trains G6080/G6079 serving between Hong Kong West Kowloon Station and Zhangjiajixi Station, as well as train G903 from Tianjin West to Hong Kong West Kowloon Station, will stop at Guangzhoubei Station, located in Huadu District, Guangzhou. The station serves as a key transportation hub, connecting to Guangzhou Metro's Guangzhou North Railway Station and Huadu Station of Intercity Railway. It is also in close proximity to Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport and Guangzhou Sunac Resort.
- **Yiwu Station:** Sleeper trains G896/G895 between Hong Kong West Kowloon Station and Shanghai Hongqiao Station will stop at Yiwu Station in Zhejiang Province. Known as the "Global Wholesale Market", Yiwu is a well-established distribution centre for small commodities.
- **Fuqingxi Station:** Trains G923/G924 running between Hong Kong West Kowloon Station and Fuzhou Station will include an additional stop at Fuqingxi Station in Fujian Province. Fuqing City is home to a range of natural and cultural attractions, including Lingshi Mountain National Forest Park and the ruins of the Southern Shaolin Temple.

Tickets will go on sale from tomorrow (17 June). MTR will continue to liaise closely with the HKSAR Government and relevant Chinese Mainland railway authorities to further enhance HSR services.

In addition, following the introduction of Quiet Cars across the high speed rail network in recent years, all MTR-operated Vibrant Express trains running between Hong Kong West Kowloon Station and Guangzhounan Station have designated the second carriage as a Quiet Car starting this month. Announcements within the carriage will be played at a lower volume, and onboard televisions will be muted. Passengers may opt for this arrangement when purchasing tickets, subject to availability.

Enhanced cross-boundary services during Tuen Ng holiday

To meet passenger demand during the Tuen Ng Festival long holiday, the East Rail Line will enhance train services during selected morning and evening periods for four consecutive days starting from 18 June (Thursday). Train frequency will be increased in both directions, with services to Lok Ma Chau Station improving from every 10 minutes to approximately every 8 minutes during designated periods (see Annex 1 for details).

Following coordination with Chinese Mainland railway authorities, HSR services will also be strengthened on Tuen Ng Festival and the following Sunday (19 and 21 June). On the festival day, an additional 11 pairs of trains will operate between Hong Kong West Kowloon Station and Futian Station. For long-haul services, an additional pair of sleeper trains will run on Thursday (18 June) between Hong Kong West Kowloon Station and Beijingxi Station. Passengers are advised to visit the 12306 online ticketing platform, the HSR website or the mobile application for the latest HSR timetable.

MTR Corporation will closely monitor the operation of all railway lines and implement passenger flow management measures where necessary to ensure smooth station operations. Passengers may also check the latest train service information via MTR Mobile or at stations to plan their journeys in advance. MTR wishes all passengers a pleasant journey in the holiday.
